It is with great pride and gratitude that we present the 2013/2014 Annual Report which highlights the Rady JCC's activities and financial performance over the past year. As you will see, it has been a great year for the Rady JCC as we have enjoyed both programmatic and financial successes. The credit must be shared between our extraordinary professional staff, dedicated lay and volunteer leadership, and our supportive and growing membership.

Membership in our fitness centre is at peak levels, our aquatics programs are immensely popular, as are our group fitness classes, which we've continued to expand to meet members' diverse needs, including Joga and Parent & Baby Yoga to name just a few new this year. Since Rady

Fitness operates in a competitive marketplace, we continually re-invest in state of the art equipment and program features. In the past year, we introduced the Training Zone and Jacob's Ladders and in the coming months a large section of the fitness floor will have a more modern look with upgrades to much of the antiquated equipment currently in place.

I invite you to review our annual report and reflect with us on our many accomplishments, but I would like to highlight two accomplishments that truly stand out in particular.

Our major fundraising event, the annual "Y" Sports Dinner celebrated its 42nd year and was a "magical" night! Thanks to the extraordinary effort of Blair Worb and the Sports Dinner Committee, the bar was raised yet again. Keynote speaker Earvin "Magic" Johnson dazzled a record crowd and helped raise \$298,000, singlehandedly raising \$75,000 in the last five minutes out of his own pocket with the auctioning off of his Lakers' tickets! It was something to see! I am confident that next year's dinner with NHL Commissioner, Gary Bettman, will be another success.

Also of note, for the last six years, a Rady JCC president has stood here and spoke of the need to increase daycare spaces in our community. At last year's meeting I spoke of our hope to have a second site operational soon with the confidential knowledge that the Rady JCC was in the running to acquire the former firehall on Grosvenor and turn it into an offsite 48-space childcare centre to supplement our existing space that's at capacity. Work continues on the Centre's design and if all goes well we will have a ribbon cutting ceremony in the near future. There have been many players and unsung heroes in this process, but I would be remiss if I didn't say a special thank you to City Councillor, John Orlikow, for supporting our proposal and championing our successful bid to purchase the property from the city.

We could not do what we do without the financial support of our funders. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to thank the He Jewish Federation of Winnipeg, the United Way, the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba, the Tallman Foundation, the Winnipeg Foundation, the Asper Foundation, the Jordan Lazareck Fund, the Mark and Dorothy Danzker Perpetual Trust Fund, the Manitoba Arts Council, and the Province of Manitoba. Executive Director's Message



It's been a banner year for the Rady JCC over the last 12 months, and the pages within this Annual Report outline those successes in detail.

We exceeded expectations throughout, enjoying growth and prosperity in our fitness memberships and cultural programming participation.

By far, one of our greatest accomplishments this year was the expansion of our Early Childhood Learning program – our day care. With generous support from the JFM and Community Places, we renovated the Kaufman Child Care Centre and added 16 permanent spaces. More importantly, we secured a location off site, allowing us to add an additional 48 preschool spaces, soon providing more families with great early learning experiences based on Jewish values.

At the core of the Rady JCC is a strong set of Jewish values. It is these values – Kehilla, Hachnasat Orchim, Ruach, Tikkun Olam – that provide the framework for the Rady JCC's staff and volunteers and shape our many programs and services. The pages enclosed within this Annual Report outline the programs and

services that align with these values.

One of our central goals is to provide opportunities for our community to experience Jewish life in innovative and engaging ways. We saw participation in these programs reach over 17,000 last year. Nothing defines Jewish peoplehood more than our ties to Israel. This year, along with our community partners, we held a number of very successful cultural events throughout the year, including Yom Ha'atzmaut last spring and the Israel Pavilion during Folklorama in August.

Children and youth are at the very heart of the Rady JCC. We are especially proud to see the continued success of our youth programs, BBYO and BBYO Connect. Last year, these programs drew more than 100 youth from all over the city and helped establish the foundation for ongoing participation in Jewish life.

We remain committed to our seniors, providing programs that engage them at every level. This year, we also expanded our Active Living Program, adding several classes and wellness programs geared toward a holistic approach to mind, body and spiritual health. Our programs for older adults reached more than 500 participants.

Our special needs programming continues to enrich the lives of over 100 participants, who in turn enrich the Rady JCC.

We are fortunate to have one of the leading fitness centres in Winnipeg. But we know that it takes vision and work to maintain this standard. The work of the Fitness Committee, with support from the Marketing Committee, established the launch of a rebranded Rady Fitness marketing campaign, which resulted in one of the best membership years in recent memory. Overall, membership increased by 144 units over 2013-14, with most notably growth in the under-35 demographic, an area of particular focus for us.

The Annual "Y" Sports Dinner was a massive success, led by legendary Magic Johnson as keynote speaker, setting the bar high for years to come. Thanks to Blair Worb, Chairperson, Ken Kronson, Chairperson Emeritus, and the rest of the committee for the amazing effort. That success is being carefully stewarded by the Board of Directors, who are committed to investing in the long-term best interests of the community.

The Rady JCC is the special place it is because of the amazing people behind the scenes. I would like to thank the Management Team, Maegan Piltzmaker, Mitch Calvert and our fabulous staff, whose commitment to our members and community is second-to-none. Along with our staff, our hundreds of volunteers define who we are. Thank you to each and every one of you. Thank you also to the Board for their ongoing support and advice. I would also like to thank Danny Stoller, whose term as President ends tonight. I have benefited greatly by working with you and thank you for your support and guidance over the past two years.

2013-14 Highlights:

Children & Family

- Continued to engage families by offering accessible programs like our Parent & Baby Drop-In Group and Family Fun Zone, drawing 75 people each week.
- Rady JCC's After School Satellite Program at Brock Corydon School saw 60 participants
- Record-setting year for Strictly Tweens program with 400 participants
- Three successful Tot Shabbat and Dinners for families with young children saw 150 participants



Summer Day Camp


- Introduced new Adamah Teen Camp (Grades 7 & 8) with sold out participation
- Introduced new Basketball Academy with 42 participants
- In total, 1,875 camper registrations (almost 900 campers) with Ruach and Keshet Camps Sold Out

- Unveiled new BBYO Connect program for teens in grades 7 & 8.
- Through BBYO and BBYO Connect, 375 teens participated in a variety of programming including teen-lead Shabbat Dinners, Cookies for a Cause and BBYO Connect Council.
- Hosted the largest Winter Convention for BBYO ever.
- Supported youth social action through J-Serve.

Ruach Fitness & Wellness





Rady JCC is a place to connect, renew and grow in a welcoming, inclusive environment, and Rady Fitness aims to live up to that standard for our members. Our fitness centre is not just a source of revenue, it's also an important part of our mission.

At Rady Fitness, everyone is welcome — from the elite athlete, to someone simply looking for a way to shed a few pounds. And we're here to help, encourage and motivate.

2013-14 Highlights:

- Increased membership overall by 144 units
- 25% increase in new member units over previous fiscal year (458 new units compared to 337)
- Continued to see growth in personal training
- Introduced monthly free fitness clinics for members
- Expanded group fitness class offerings, notably for families and teens
- Increased attendance in group fitness classes
- Expanded Active Living for Older Adults fitness and holistic health programs (Modified pilates and yoga etc.)
- Introduced group training on the **Training Zone** cage, a functional training system that's one of the first-of-its-kind in Winnipeg
- Over 4,500 participants in aquatics setting a new benchmark
- 80% of Rady JCC members report they are highly satisfied

Tikkun Olam social responsibility



The Rady JCC believes that while an individual's journey is paramount, a Jewish journey takes place with others so that they can be enriched by one another's experiences. It's a place where everyone can explore and experience Jewish culture and tradition, and enrich their lives – regardless of background, age or spiritual beliefs.

2013-14 Highlights:

- Our financial assistance program continued to provide over **\$200,000** in scholarships and camperships to financially disadvantaged families
- Our Intergenerational collaboration between Active Living for Older Adults and Kaufman Child Care Centre **Learning through the Generations** grew to 20 volunteer participants in its second year. Volunteers participate in holiday baking, gardening, zumba, art, reading and more with the children
- Fun and Fitness with Friends special needs programs were well attended, with 20% more active participants in 2013-14
- Teen Connection Camp for individuals with special needs grew to 28 participants
- Continued to see strong participation in the CJA and United Way campaigns from staff and members, with 80% of Rady employees contributing to the CJA campaign and we saw a 20% increase in funds raised for United Way compared to previous year.
- J-Serve, program aimed at engaging youth in community service, had 60 participants.
- Assisted 48 newcomer families to become members and participate fully in the JCC.

Kehilla strengthening community



Holding true to its mission, the Rady JCC prides itself on being a place where Jewish values flourish, facilitating programming that does just that. The Rady JCC is home to a number of cultural events throughout the year that speak to our values and play an important role in the community.

Last year, we provided over 6,000 hours of Jewish life/educational programming, amounting to 250 24-hour days or two years worth of a full-time, 40 hour work week.

2013-14 Highlights:

- Tarbut: Festival of Jewish Culture 2013 attracted over 3,000 patrons
- Over 2,400 people enjoyed the 2014 Winnipeg International Jewish Film Festival in May
- Mameloshen: Festival of Yiddish Culture attracted over 1,000 participants
- The Rady JCC played host to more than 10,000 visitors at **Israel Pavilion, Shalom Square**, during Folklorama providing an opportunity to showcase the Chai Folk Ensemble and give Winnipeggers the true Israel experience.
- Jewish Life programs **People of the Book Jewish Book Club and Zooming In** saw continued engagement and positive feedback within the community
- Over 600 people participated in Family Holiday Programs throughout the year, including **our Rosh Hashana** Cooking Workshop, Sukkot Sunday events and much more
- We acknowledged our connection to Israel through the **Yom Ha'atzmaut** celebration. Over 2,500 people of all ages enjoyed a variety of activities including Israeli food, live entertainment and fireworks.
- Engaged the community and benefitted from the involvement of 500 volunteers.

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Report of the Independent Auditors on the Summarized Financial Statements

To the Directors of

The Y.M.H.A. Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc.

The accompanying summarized financial statements, which comprise the statement of financial position as at August 31, 2014 and the statement of operations for the year then ended, are derived from the audited financial statements of The Y.M.H.A. Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc. for the year ended August 31, 2014. We expressed a qualified audit opinion on those financial statements in our report dated December 1, 2014 (see below).

The summarized financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required by Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Reading the summarized financial statements, therefore, is not a substitute for reading the audited financial statements of the organization.

Management's Responsibility for the Summarized Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of a summary of the audited financial statements on the following basis:

The summarized financial statements include the major totals and subtotals from the related complete financial statements dealing with matters having a pervasive or otherwise significant effect on the summarized financial statements.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the summarized financial statements based on our procedures, which were conducted in accordance with Canadian Auditing Standard (CAS) 810, "Engagements to Report on Summary of Financial Statements".

Opinion

In our opinion, the summarized financial statements derived from the audited financial statements of The Y.M.H.A. Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc. for the year ended August 31, 2014 are a fair summary of those statements, on the basis described above. However, the summarized financial statements are misstated to the equivalent extent as the audited financial statements of The Y.M.H.A. Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc. for the year ended August 31, 2014.

The possible misstatement of the audited financial statements is described in our qualified audit opinion in our report dated December 1, 2014. Our qualified audit opinion is based on the fact that the Organization derives part of its revenue from the general public in the form of contributions and fundraising which are not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Organization and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to contributions and fundraising, excess of revenues over expenses, current assets and changes in fund balances. Our qualified audit opinion states that, except for the possible effects of the described matter, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of The Y.M.H.A. Jewish Community Centre of Winnipeg, Inc. as at August 31, 2014, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.
